INTRODUCTION

In Luke 20, Jesus is asked some difficult questions. But his response ends up being a better question for us to consider. In this series we will look at some of the questions we've used to keep God at a distance, and how a better question could change everything.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. The Jewish people expected a man to lead them and a God to save them. Jesus is both for us. Which one is harder for you to embrace, Jesus as your leader or Jesus as your savior?
2. Jesus created the world, stepped into the world he created, lived the life, died the death, conquered the grave, and then pursues us individually. Which of those are you most thankful for right now and why?
3. The religious leaders were primarily concerned with outward appearances. This led them to some really ugly actions and decisions. In what way is it difficult for you to live your faith in front of others? Why?

MOVING FORWARD

1. Sometimes we know the truth, we just don't want to face it. Is there any area of your life where that is the case, and if so, what do you need to do to start acting on the truth?
2. When you saw people getting baptized, what were you thinking and feeling? What next step are you encouraged to take after witnessing that?
3. How can the group support you?
